THE COOK POLITICAL REPORT

Election Night Cheat Sheet

November 3, 2020

How to use this chart:

This cheat sheet is designed to help navigate election night. The states are listed in order of poll closing time.

Counting absentee votes can take longer than processing Election Day returns. We included some factors that can help show how quick or lengthy it will take for each state to be called:

- •When were the races called in 2016, and how much of the vote still had to be counted the Wednesday after election night? In the past, the number of votes that must be counted after Election Day varies by state. While 2020 presents a whole host of new challenges, states with a high percentage of outstanding votes in 2016 are likely to be similar in 2020.
- Is there no excuse absentee? States where there is no excuse needed to vote absentee will probably see more absentee voters.
- •Is there early voting and when does it start? States with lengthy early voting should have more ballots processed by election night. (This does not always apply in states with in-person absentee voting)
- Can ballots be received past Election Day? Many states allow ballots to be received in the mail past Election Day. In very close races, this may delay calls.
- Can absentee ballots be processed are or counted if before Election Day? States that can process and count absentee votes prior to Election Day should have more votes counted by the time polls close.
- Finally we note states states that mail ballots to every voters , states that can't start counting ab ballots until after Election Day 🛱 and what votes states hope to have reported first 💆
